# (1) PROPOSED RE-ELECTION OF RETIRING DIRECTORS, (2) PROPOSED RE-APPOINTMENT OF AUDITOR, AND (3) PROPOSED GRANTING OF GENERAL MANDATES TO ISSUE AND REPURCHASE SHARES

### (1) INTRODUCTION

The main purpose of this circular is to provide you with, among other things:

- (i) further information as is necessary to enable you to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against the resolutions to be proposed at the AGM relating to:
  - (a) the proposed re-election of retiring Directors in accordance with the Articles;
  - (b) the proposed re-appointment of auditor; and
  - (c) the proposed granting to the Directors of the Issue Mandate and the Repurchase Mandate.

### (2) PROPOSED RE-ELECTION OF RETIRING DIRECTORS

Pursuant to Article 83(3) of the Articles, the Board shall have power to appoint a Director whose appointment shall only be until the first annual general meeting after his/her appointment but then be eligible for re-election. Besides, pursuant to Article 84(1) of the Articles, one-third of the Directors (or, if their number is not a multiple of three, the number nearest to but not less than one third) shall retire from office by rotation at each annual general meeting provided that every Director shall be subject to retirement at an annual general meeting at least once every three years. The retiring Directors, all being eligible, offer themselves for re-election. At the AGM, ordinary resolutions set out in resolutions numbered 2 to 6 of the notice of the AGM will be proposed to re-elect Mr. Wu Lijue and Ms. Huang Jieli as executive Directors, Mr. Lau Kwok Fai Patrick, Ms. Shi Ying and Mr. Zhong Hui as independent non-executive Directors, respectively.

Biographical details of each of the retiring Directors who are proposed to be re-elected at the AGM are set out in Appendix I to this circular.

### (3) PROPOSED RE-APPOINTMENT OF AUDITOR

Ernst & Young will retire as the auditor of the Company at the AGM and being eligible, offer themselves for re-appointment as the auditor of the Company. Details of the re-appointment of auditor are set out in the ordinary resolution numbered 7 of the notice of the AGM.

### (4) GENERAL MANDATES

### (a) Issue Mandate

At the AGM, an ordinary resolution set out in resolution numbered 8 of the notice of the AGM will be proposed to the Shareholders to consider and, if thought fit, to grant to the Directors a new general and unconditional mandate to allot, issue and deal with the Shares up to a maximum of 20% of the total number of issued Shares as at the date of passing of the relevant ordinary resolution. As at the Latest Practicable Date, the total number of Shares in issue was 360,000,000. Subject to the passing of the proposed resolution, the maximum number of new Shares to be issued under the Issue Mandate will be 72,000,000 Shares (assuming that no further Shares will be issued or repurchased prior to the AGM).

The biographical details of the retiring Directors proposed to be re-elected at the AGM are set out as follows:

Mr. Wu Lijue (吳理覺), aged 60, is the founder and controlling shareholder of our Group, the chairman of our Board, an executive Director and our chief executive officer. He was appointed as a Director on 26 May 2017, and is currently responsible for our Group's strategic planning and overall operation, and management of our Board. Mr. Wu has over 31 years of experience in the tantalum and niobium metallurgy industry. Mr. Wu is currently also the director of certain companies in which the Group has share interests, including certain subsidiary companies of the Company.

Mr. Wu obtained his bachelor's degree in powder metallurgy from Central South University (中南大學) in 1984, obtained his EMBA degree from the School of Management of Sun Yat-sen University (中山大學) in 2011, and is a senior engineer. Mr. Wu is also the vice president of the Tantalum and Niobium Division and rotating president of the Cobalt Division of the China Nonferrous Metals Industry Association, the vice president of the Qingyuan Metal Industry Chamber of Commerce\* (清遠市金屬行業商會), an outstanding entrepreneur of Guangdong Province, the 5th Session of Outstanding Constructor of Socialism with Chinese Characteristics among Non-public Economic Personnel of Guangdong Province, the executive committee member of the 8th Executive Committee of the Qingyuan Federation of Industry and Commerce, and the vice chairman of the Qingyuan Federation of Industry and Commerce, and has won many awards such as an outstanding individual for "Poverty Alleviation". Save as disclosed above, Mr. Wu did not hold any directorships in listed companies or any other major appointments in Hong Kong or overseas in the three years preceding the Latest Practicable Date.

Mr. Wu is the uncle of Ms. Wu Shuangzhu, the controller of corporate department of the Group. The latest service contract was renewed on 19 February 2024 until being terminated pursuant to the terms of the service contract. Under the service agreement, Mr. Wu is currently entitled to an annual basic salary of RMB901,000 and a discretionary year-end bonus of an amount to be determined by the Board and approved by the remuneration committee of the Board. The Board determined the remuneration package of Mr. Wu on the basis of the Company's performance, together with Mr. Wu's qualifications, responsibilities, experience, contributions to and positions held with the Company.

By virtue of the SFO, as at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Wu is deemed to be interested in the 205,000,000 Shares directly held by Jiawei Resources Seychelles, which is wholly owned by him. These Shares represent approximately 56.94% of the issued share capital of the Company. Ms. Huang graduated from Guangdong University of Foreign Studies\* (廣東外語外質大學) with a major in English, and has nearly 20 years of experience in marketing, global key account development and corporate business management. Ms Huang was appointed as an executive Director and a member of the remuneration committee of the Company with effect from 25 March 2024.

Ms. Huang has entered into a service contract with the Company for a term of three years commencing from 25 March 2024 and is subject to retirement by rotation and re-election at the upcoming annual general meeting of the Company in accordance with the articles of association of the Company. Under the service contract, Ms. Huang is entitled to a monthly basic salary of RMB63,518 and a discretionary year-end bonus of an amount to be determined by the Board and approved by the Remuneration Committee. The Board determined the remuneration package of Ms. Huang on the basis of the Company's performance, together with Ms. Huang's qualifications, responsibilities, experience, contributions to and positions held with the Company, in particular to her in-depth marketing and management experience which is considered to be highly beneficial to the Company's business growth and development.

Save as disclosed above, as at the Latest Practicable Date, (i) Ms. Huang did not have any relationship with any Directors, senior management or substantial or controlling shareholders of the Company; (ii) she did not have any interest in the shares or underlying shares of the Company within the meaning of Part XV of the Securities and Futures Ordinance (Chapter 571 of the Laws of Hong Kong); (iii) she did not hold any other directorships in public companies the securities of which are listed on any securities market in Hong Kong or overseas in the last three years; and (iv) she did not hold other positions with other members of the Group.

There is no other information which is required to be disclosed pursuant to the requirements of Rules 13.51(2)(h) to 13.51(2)(v) of the Listing Rules relating to the appointment of Ms. Huang and there is no other matter that needs to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders.

Mr. Lau Kwok Fai Patrick (劉國輝), HKICPA, FCCA, aged 51, was appointed as an independent non-executive Director on 19 February 2020. Mr. Lau obtained an honours diploma in accounting from Hong Kong Shue Yan College (now known as Hong Kong Shue Yan University) in July 1996. He later obtained a master's degree in Corporate Governance and Directorship (Distinction) from Hong Kong Baptist University in November 2014. He also obtained his HKICPA Diploma in Insolvency awarded by the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants in June 2004. Mr. Lau has been a fellow member of the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants and an associate of the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants (formerly known as Hong Kong Society of Accountants) since December 2007 and July 2003, respectively. He has also been a member of Beta Gamma Sigma Hong Kong Baptist University Chapter since April 2014.

### (1) SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the Company has a total of 360,000,000 Shares in issue. Subject to the passing of the relevant resolution(s) as set out in the notice of the AGM and assuming that no further Shares are issued or repurchased by the Company prior to the AGM, the Directors will be authorised to repurchase up to 36,000,000 Shares (being 10% of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of the AGM) pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate during the period ending on the earliest of (i) the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company; (ii) the expiration of the period within which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required by any applicable laws or its Articles to be held; and (iii) the revocation and variation of the authority given under resolution numbered 9 of the notice of the AGM by an ordinary resolution of the Shareholders in general meeting.

### (2) REASONS FOR REPURCHASE

The Directors believe that it is in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders for the Directors to be granted a general mandate from the Shareholders to enable the Company to repurchase Shares in the market. Save as aforesaid, the Directors are not aware of any consequence which would arise under the Takeovers Code as a result of any repurchase pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate.

The Directors will not exercise the Repurchase Mandate if the repurchase would result in the number of Shares which are in the hands of the public falling below 25% of the total number of Shares in issue (or such other percentage as may be prescribed as the minimum public shareholding under the Listing Rules).
